Have A Nice Day Pike/Musky Fly:

Materials Needed:

Hook: Large, Wide Streamer Hook (I have used Daiichi 2461, size 2/0-5/0 for this fly)

Head: Thingamabobber, 1 inch or smaller

Tail: Orange Barred Rabbit Strip (Tiger Colored) or other hot colored Strip

Flash: Gold, Holographic Yellow, and Copper Flashabou

Legs: Limber Legs Spinnerbait Skirt

Collar: Yellow, Pink, or Orange Deer Body Hair

Thread: Heavy 3/0 or stronger

Glue: Zap A Gap or similar for securing the Thingamabobber

Steps for tying this fly:

1. Slide Thingamabobber over hook shank toward the eye of the hook

- 2. Cover the hook with thread, then use the tread to secure the thingamabobber by building it up in front of and behind of the bobber
- 3. Bring the thread to the back of the hook, and tie in the rabbit strip
- 4. Tie in the desired amount of flashabou above and below the rabbit
- 5. Bring the thread forward a bit, and tie in the rubber legs. Depending on the length of the hook, you may want to dub in a body of ice dub
- 6. Collar: Tie a thick clump of deer hair around the hook and make it flair.
- 7. Collar 2: Tie in a clump of hot colored ice dub in front of the deer hair (optional)
- 8. Finish the fly behind the bobber.
- 9. Use some glue to secure the bobber behind the eye of the hook. A single pike can ruin this part of the fly, so the glue is important!

Comments:

This is a difficult fly to cast but a very fun one to fish. It pushes water much like a small duck or mouse would in the water. It should be stripped with a steady retrieve or it can be swung in current. The glue is important on this fly. Often, when using flies like this, I bring some UV wader repair glue and use it on the fly to make repairs if it is getting tattered.
